


Transit of Mercury: A Once in a Lifetime Event!

The Besser Museum and Planetarium will be hosting a FREE Transit of Mercury Viewing Party for anyone and everyone.








Cut Paper Designs by Shirley Ritzler On Exhibit: January 26 - June 30, 2020


